It is a pleasure to share with you the latest news on the activities of the International Society.

Message from the President

Dear friends and colleagues,

This year we celebrate the 60th Anniversary of the International Society for Labour and Social Security Law. Indeed, our Society was constituted in Brussels in June 1958. As most of you already know, it was the merger of the International Society for Social Law (Sao Paulo Congress, 1954 and Brussels Congress, 1958) and the International Congresses of Labour Law (Trieste, 1951 and Geneva, 1957). We should be proud for all the work done by the Society so far and we all should continue to work together for a robust Society in the coming future.

Preparation for the World Congress of our Society to be held in Turin on 4-7 September 2018 is well underway. The ILO campus of Turin is ready to welcome the participants and I am sure that it will be a very welcoming place for our work.

In order to facilitate a large participation, we have decided to keep a low registration fee, especially for students and young researchers. Moreover, in the recent years, the activities of the Young Legal Scholars have greatly developed, and I am sure that we will see further results also in Turin.

As you can see on our website, we have launched a Call for Papers that is receiving a very positive response from various parts of the world. At the time of writing, they are over 100. From what we can see so far, these abstracts proposals are very interesting and in line with the main research themes approved at the last World Congress held in Cape Town in September 2015. In this regard, please note that you can answer to the Call for Papers either by contributions aimed at integrating research materials of the seven research groups that will be used by the coordinators in view of their presentation in Turin, and/or with separate contributions but always connected to the themes of our

research. For such contributions, there will be specific sessions at Congress in the afternoons of Wednesday, 5 September and Thursday, 6 September. The contributions can be delivered in one of the official languages of the Society. Please note that for these sessions there will be no interpretation.

In addition, as already announced, two half-days will be organized by the Italian Association (AIDLASS) with the aim of promoting the participation of Italian scholars to discuss themes and topics of relevance to the Italian context from a comparative viewpoint. For these two sessions, there will be interpretation provided in the four languages of the Congress.

Following the practice started after Cape Town, research materials developed by the seven research groups have been presented and discussed at various seminars and conferences of the International Society with a view to facilitating a wider exchange of information among scholars.

For example, at the European Congress of Prague, held on 20-22 September 2017, which was a great success, three themes of the seven groups were presented in the plenary sessions, notably new forms of social security, the role of the State and industrial relations, and migrant workers.

Moreover, the Young Scholars during the Prague conference discussed a forth theme of the research groups, most notably “organization, productivity and well-being at work”.

The international Seminar in Venice of the 2017 edition discussed the theme “Global Trade and Social Rights” and the next edition to be held in May 2018 will deal with “The role of the State and Industrial Relations”.

A new edition of the Tokyo Seminar will take place on 28-29 March 2018 and it will be a valuable opportunity, as it was the 2017 edition, to test the central issues for the future of labour law. Both the Secretary-General Giuseppe Casale and I will attend.

For the same purpose, I will participate in the next Seminar organized in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic on March 5- 10 2018 and I will present a paper on “Rights and humanisation of work.”

These different activities widely presented on the Society’s website testify the vitality of our national associations and the contribution they make to a better understanding of the challenges that the major transformations are posing to labour law and social security systems.

In this regard, I renew my appeal to our national associations to take action in the coming months to promote research and inputs with a view to further contributing to the success of the XXII ISLSSL World Congress of Turin.

Finally, I would like to congratulate Janice Bellace who was elected President-Elect by the Executive Committee of ISLSSL in Prague. In Torino, Janice will succeed me as President of our Society for the period 2018-21. I am sure that her experience and great knowledge for labour affairs and industrial relations will be valuable for the growth of our work.

XII European Regional Congress (Prague, 2017)

The XII European Regional Congress took place in Prague (Czech Republic) on 20-22 September 2017. More than 250 participants in representation of 38 countries attended the Congress. New Members of the ISLSSL

Bolivia, Slovak Republic and Switzerland have been unanimously admitted as Members of the ISLSSL by the ISLSSL Executive Committee.

African Labour Law Society Congress (Sun City, South Africa)

The African Labour Law Society (ALLS) conference was held at Sun City, North West Province, South Africa, on the 7th September 2017. The Conference was held the day before the South African Society for Labour Law's 20th Annual event. The operations were managed by the Secretariat of SASLAW. The theme of the Conference was "African Perspectives on Labour Law: Theory and Practice". The speaker line-up included eminent labour academics and practitioners from the continent. Prof Evance Kalula was the keynote speaker and was instrumental in the formulation of the programme. Two Deans of Faculties of Law (Professor Avinash Govindjee and Professor George Mpedi) and the ILO Country Director of Southern Africa (Dr Joni Musabayana) also delivered thought provoking talks. There were 176 delegates from 14 African countries at the Conference. The sponsors of the event were the ILO, Webber Wentzel and Lex Africa.

The ALLS committee met on the 9th of September and draft by-laws were compiled. The membership of the Society now stands at 100 members from 13 different countries of the region. The committee will decide whether to host the next Conference before the SASLAW 21st Conference on 6 September 2018.

Graduate Seminar on International and Comparative Law “Isla de Margarita” (Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic)

A new edition of the Graduate Seminar on International and Comparative Law usually held at Isla Margarita (Venezuela) will take place in Hotel B&P, Santo Domingo on 5-10 March 2018. This year's theme is “Trends and contemporary issues of Labour Law”. Please find in Annex I the information on the Seminar. As in the past, the Society will award grants to facilitate the participation of young legal scholars under the age of 40, preferably under 35.

Seminar on Comparative Labour Policy (Tokyo, Japan)

The second International JILPT Labour Policy Seminar will take place in Tokyo on 28-29 March 2018. The theme is “Looking back at the policy responses to changes in employment structure and forms. The future as seen from here”. In this era of globalization and large-scale innovation of information technology, labour related issues have become universal, spanning the globe. This two-day seminar will examine the major labour policy issues in the world today. Please see Annex II for more information on the event.

Seminar on International and Comparative Labour Law (Venice, Italy)

The 5th International Seminar on International and Comparative Labour Law will be organised in Venice on 7-11 May 2018. Under the direction of Prof. Adalberto Perulli, the Seminar will deal with the theme “The Role of the State and Industrial Relations”. The full seminar programme, designed at the highest academic level, will soon be available. As the previous four editions, the participation of young legal scholars under the age of 40 is encouraged. The ISLSSL with the assistance of the Seminar's Scientific Committee will grant six fellowships of 1,000 Euro each. Please see Annex III for more information on registration and fellowships.

a. XXII World Congress of Labour and Social Security Law (Turin, 2018)

The XXII World Congress of Labour and Social Security Law will take place in Italy on 4-7 September 2018 in Turin. Please note that the deadline for the “Call for Papers” has been postponed until 28 February 2018. Special fees for early bird registration are offered until mid-March 2018. We look forward to meeting all of you in Turin.

b. XI American Regional Congress of Labour and Social Security Law (Cordoba, 2019)

The XI American Regional Congress of Labour and Social Security Law will take place in Cordoba (Argentina) on 4-6 September 2019. The Agenda of the American Regional Congress will be shared as early as possible.

Young Legal Scholars Section: Initiatives 2017-2018

– ELLYS (European Labour Law Young Scholars) Subsection

a. ELLYS Meeting, Gdansk 5-7 July 2017

The third ELLYS meeting was hosted by Gdansk University on 5-7 July 2017 and was dedicated to the theme on “Organisation, productivity and well-being at work”. It included four separated sessions.

The 1st session, with three contributions, was dedicated to the specific topic of the possibility to combine paid work and care responsibilities for (young) children.

The 2nd session’s topic was slightly broader, the two presentations dealt with different aspects of atypical work and its consequences on organisation, productivity and well-being.

The 3rd session dealt with two different topics, the first three interventions focussed on developments and problems concerning working time and working place, and generally stated a growing intertwinement of work and private life. The second topic was the vulnerability of (certain categories of) employees.

The 4th session centred on collective labour law aspects. Here, the focus ranged from CLA arrangements on working conditions, CLA and disciplinary action via the question of allowing deviation from law by CLA to transnational collective agreements.

At the end of the first day, the organizers offered an impressive show of Polish culture and a nice dinner. In the afternoon of the second day, they organized a nice visit to the European Centre of Solidarity

During the Seminar, the ELLYS assembly elected David Carvalho Martins (Portugal) as new coordinator together with Nicola Gundt (Netherlands) and Maciej Łaga (Poland). The assembly decided also to improve the mailing list (if you are interested to join, please send an email to nicola.gundt@maastrichtuniversity.nl), the creation of a Facebook group and the release of two volumes (see below).

b. XII European Labour Law Regional Congress – Young Scholars’ Session.

On 20 September 2017, in Prague within the XII ISLSSL European Regional Congress the Young Legal Scholars Session met on “Organization, Flexibility and Well-Being in Employment Law”. Representatives from the Czech Republic, Slovakia, Italy, Poland, Portugal, Slovak Republic and Spain presented papers.

c. Volumes in course of publication

The Young Legal Scholars Section will publish: “Labour Law and Social Rights in Europe: The Jurisprudence of International Courts” (proceedings of 2015 Santiago de Compostela Meeting) and “Organization, flexibility and well-being in employment law: current issues” (proceedings of Gdansk Meeting and YS Session held in Prague during the XII ISLSSL European Regional Congress).

– Latin American Subsection

The session of the American Young Legal Scholars Subsection will take place in the Dominican Republic from March 5 to 10 2018 during the VIII International Seminar on Comparative Labour Law “Isla de Margarita”. The theme of the seminar is “Trends and contemporary issues of Labour Law”. Young scholars from the entire region will take part in this session. After the successful experience had in the American Meeting of Young Legal Scholars held in Santiago de Chile in 2017, the Latin American Sub Section would meet in Montevideo (Uruguay) for its second congress. The main theme will be “Thinking about the future of Labour Law: the reconciliation between work and personal life”.

– Next initiatives

In the coming weeks, the Young Legal Scholars Section will disseminate a Call for Papers for the Young Scholars sessions to be held on 4 September 2018 on the occasion of the XXII ISLSSL World Congress in Turin and the Announcement of the next ELLYS Meeting which will take place in Gdansk at the beginning of July 2018.

NOTA HISTÓRICA:

El Seminario Internacional de Derecho Comparado del Trabajo se ha venido efectuando en la Isla de Margarita, Venezuela, por iniciativa de la Sociedad Internacional de Derecho del Trabajo y de la Seguridad Social (SIDTSS) que propuso a Universitas Fundación la realización de un ciclo de estudios avanzados dedicados a especialistas en esta disciplina, idea propuesta en la ciudad de Colonia, Uruguay, en el año 2009 que, previamente había sido gestada en la discusión de la SIDTSS durante la reunión ejecutiva de su directiva en el Congreso Mundial de Sidney, Australia, de ese mismo año. Así, Universitas Fundación aceptó el compromiso y celebró en el año 2011 su primera edición del Seminario, con el auspicio de la Universidad de Margarita.

A finales del año 2012, en el Congreso Mundial de Derecho del Trabajo y de la Seguridad Social celebrado en Santiago de Chile, la Sociedad Internacional de Derecho del Trabajo y de la Seguridad Social en el Comité Ejecutivo, dispuso considerarlo de manera formal como una de sus actividades formativas para la América Latina al modo de los seminarios que la Sociedad auspiciara desde hace décadas en Europa, sucesivamente en Szeged, Bordeaux, en Lyon-Saint Etienne, Francia y actualmente en Venecia, Italia.

Se han celebrado a la fecha siete (7) programas de este Seminario Internacional, cumpliéndose en el año 2018 su octava edición, donde se han abordado las variadas modalidades en que se manifiesta el Derecho del Trabajo y sus ramas afines.

El séptimo (2017) se realizó en Villa Carlos Paz, Provincia de Córdoba, Argentina. Para la realización de su octava edición (2018) se ha decidido celebrarlo en Santo Domingo, República Dominicana.

OBJETIVO GENERAL:

El objetivo general del programa consiste en que los participantes profundicen en el conocimiento teórico y práctico en relación con el contenido y funcionamiento de las últimas tendencias del Derecho del Trabajo y sus ramas afines, sus principios articuladores, los actores sociales y las instituciones que del ordenamiento jurídico emanan. Se persigue perfeccionar el conocimiento de los participantes sobre el Derecho del Trabajo, mediante el estudio de la legislación laboral, la jurisprudencia, la doctrina y la práctica forense a nivel comparado internacional.

METODOLOGÍA ACADÉMICA:

Los aspirantes a participar en el seminario deberán leer previamente sobre los temas que serán tratados en el seminario y habrán de elaborar un informe escrito nacional, para compartir su experiencia con los participantes de otros países, en el cual, expondrán sus ideas, haciendo referencia específica a la realidad nacional de su país en la materia, siguiendo un esquema o matriz que será proporcionado por los organizadores. El informe deberá contar entre quince y veinte (15-20) páginas escritas en letra Arial punto 12 a espacio 1,5. El mismo deberá ser enviado por correo electrónico a la Fundación, al menos, con una semana de anticipación al seminario. Los informes serán expuestos oralmente durante la realización del seminario, de acuerdo con la organización y metodología que se informará el día de la instalación.

El primer día del seminario se dictará una clase introductoria sobre el Derecho Comparado del Trabajo para interiorizar la modalidad metódica que será aplicada durante todo el seminario. Ese mismo día, se formarán grupos de participantes procurando mezclar dentro de cada grupo a alumnos de diferentes nacionalidades. Cada uno de los temas será expuesto por los profesores respectivos escogido para tal fin, durante una hora académica. A continuación se realizará un panel, en el cual, los otros profesores presentes, expondrán sus comentarios ante la conferencia. Luego habrá un receso. Después del receso se abre un debate con participación de los asistentes al seminario y los profesores. Los grupos formados con los asistentes al seminario recibirán del conferencista de cada día, varios puntos a discutir, relativos al tema de la conferencia, un punto para cada grupo, éstos se reunirán durante tres horas en la tarde, luego del almuerzo, en el lugar previamente fijado por la coordinación del seminario, para discutir, trabajar y resolver la pregunta asignada, y así deberán redactar un informe breve (máximo 3 páginas). As labor problems become more universal with the advance of globalization in recent years, there is a growing need for international comparative research in the planning and formulation of labor policy. With this in mind, JILPT started to hold annually the “JILPT Tokyo Comparative Labor Policy Seminar” from March, 2017 to provide an opportunity for researchers from major countries and regions, particularly Asia, to come together and engage in a comparative examination of their shared challenges. Through these seminars, we aim to build a network among researchers, research institutions, and people in the labor field, and to improve the quality of young researchers, especially those in Asia.

“Looking back at the policy responses to changes in employment structure and forms”

—The future as seen from here—

5. Theme background and aims

Technological innovation is leading to changes in the industrial structure, and employment structure and forms are approaching an era of further change. Most typically, Internet-related technology developed at such a dramatic pace in the final decade of the 20th century that it is no longer merely a tool for obtaining information; instead, it is now ushering in a society in which all kinds of things are being linked together through the Internet. Meanwhile, computing technology, which has also developed to an advanced level, has now reached the realm of artificial intelligence (AI), and it has even been suggested that it will not only complement human labor but could replace it in the near future. The consequence of these technological innovations is that humans are being liberated from spatial and temporal constraints, and as a result, employment structure and forms are also on the verge of change. However, such changes are nothing new. Labor has always adapted to keep pace with changes in industrial structure resulting from major technological innovation. The arrival of the Internet technology is a new dramatic change amid the constant stream of innovation we have been experiencing.

On the other hand, technological innovation also contributes to the progressive globalization of economies, and this has also changed employment structure and forms. But while companies enjoy many benefits from increasingly borderless markets, excessive competition among those markets has

clearly highlighted the negative aspects of this trend. Specifically, there are people who not only suffer the knock-on effects of globalization caught in the midst of market competition and are therefore unable to enjoy its fruits, but also sink to the bottom of a widening disparity. The reality of people working in the informal sector, which is said to be the most vulnerable to this negative impact, has not been accurately grasped, even in official statistics. It has also been pointed out that these people are still outside the safety net of their countries' legal protection.

Since the speed and scale of technological progress as well as its impact differ from country to country, changes in industrial structure and the degree of progress in economic globalization will also vary. In some countries, there may also be unique changes in the structure of society. Recognizing this point, JILPT would like to clarify how labor policy in various countries has responded so far to changes in the employment structure and forms. By comparing the responses to date in these countries, their shared problems as well as problems unique to each country will become clear. Moreover, their respective processes in addressing these issues could provide new knowledge (hints) for future policy responses in each country. An image of the new future for labor will hopefully come into view as a result of our discussion at this Seminar.

Based on the perspectives outlined above, we present the following four points for the participants to report on. Participants should focus on one or more of the four. We encourage reports that are based on data.

Points

- 1) Changes in industrial structure due to technological innovation, and its impact on changes in employment structure and forms
 - What impact have changes in industrial structure due to technological innovation had so far on changes in employment structure and forms? What is the situation at the moment? (For example, employment problems due to changes in industrial structure, structural conversion problems due to industry upgrading, problems with the privatization of state corporations, problems of new employment forms resulting from IoT and AI, etc.)
- 2) Changes in employment structure and forms caused by economic globalization due to technological innovation
 - What sort of impact has economic globalization accelerated by technological innovation had so far on changes in employment structure and forms, and what sort of problems has it caused? (For example, regular vs. non-regular disparity problems, informal sector problems, etc.)
- 3) Changes in employment structure and forms due to changes in social structure
 - What sort of impact have demographic changes and other changes in social structure had so far on changes in employment structure and forms? And what kind of issues have arisen? (For example, birth rate decline and population aging problems, problems of movement from rural to urban areas, immigration problems, etc.)
- 4) Policy responses to changes in employment structure and forms
 - How has policy responded so far to changes in employment structure and forms, and how is it responding now? (Transitions in policy from the past to the present)
 - How should policy planning respond to new changes in employment structure and forms? (Future policy aims)
